

## Parish Council News – November 2018

### **Hartlebury Community Project**

Progress on the project continues to be disappointingly slow. However, the work completed is of a high standard so we ask that residents be patient. When the project is completed we will make sure that you have the opportunity to give us your feedback on the end product. Hopefully we will all be pleased. In the interim can we dispel some concerns? We took handover of the car park to the front of the Parish Hall before it was finished to try to, at least, give some parking whilst the rear car park was completed. The gravel on the current surface of the front car park will be removed and the parking bays will be marked with the appropriate disabled signs and hatching on completion. There will also be additional parking at the side of the MUGA with a path leading to the new play areas. In total there will be 53 parking spaces.

### **Chloros**

Some of you may have received a leaflet from a private company called Chloros who are seeking to open a site on the Hartlebury Trading Estate to deal with hazardous waste.

We have advised Chloros that not all residents have received this leaflet and have asked that we can publish it on the Parish Council website. We have also told them that the timing for giving feedback or asking questions is insufficient and should be extended, and advised them that they should hold a public meeting when members of the public can ask questions directly. We have given them the details of how to book the Parish Hall so that they can conduct meaningful public consultation.

Whilst this proposed development is in the parish of Elmley Lovett we would expect to be consulted should an application be submitted to Wychavon for planning consent. If this happens we will attempt to let you know so that, if you wish, you can forward comments directly to Wychavon. Some of you may prefer to submit your comments via the Parish Council, so again we will alert you as to when it will be on the Council agenda for discussion. If you prefer you can send us your comments by email – as some of you have already done - and we will ensure that your views are reflected in our response.

### **Free Bricks**
